




JAPANESE LANTERN

Cut, color and decorate the lantern. Fold in half lengthwise along gray line. Cut along the datted lines. Unfald. Wrap around to connect A to A and B to B. Glue or tape the top and battom closed. Tie string through the holes and hang. These symbols represent love and friendship.




This lantern is for decorative purposes only. Not to be illuminated with lights or candles.




GREEK LENTEN CALENDAR


DREAM CATCHER




MEXICAN FESTIVAL FLAGS




Poppies to Remember


Latino Luminary
